# Notes: Negative Sentences

# What is a negative sentence?

Sentences that state something is not true. The word "not" defines a negative sentence and it appears after an auxiliary verb. Auxiliary verbs are to be (am, is, are, was, were); to have (have, has, had); to do (do, does, did).



# Examples of negative sentences:

- I am not going to cinema.
- He is not here.
- They are not going to the park.
- She was not drawing on the table.
- We were not hearing you.
- Tom does not have a pet.
- Maria and June do not like to sing.



Informally, the negative sentence is done in the contracted form.

### Example:

- do + not = don't
- is + not = isn't
- are + not = aren't
- was + not = wasn't
- were + not = weren't
- does + not = doesn't



## Sentences in the negative:

- He isn't here.
- They aren't going to the park.
- She wasn't drawing on the table.
- We weren't hearing you.
- Tom doesn't have a pet.
- Maria and June don't like to sing.

There are other words that can make a statement false.



They are:

no, none, no one,  
nobody, nothing,  
neither, nowhere,  
never.



## Some more examples:

- I had no idea she was there.
- None of the children thought to wash the dirty dishes.
- No one is in the library.
- Nobody cared enough to share their food with the hungry child.
- Glen wants nothing to do with David.
- He plays neither cricket nor football.
- We have nowhere to go today.
- I will never eat an insect.



Note:


A double negative sentence combines the negative form of a verb with a negative pronoun. Such a sentence really mean something positive.




Example: I did not do nothing.

This really means: I did do something.





What should you have said if this sentence was really supposed to be negative sentences.



- I did not do anything.
