


KEYBOARDING

In this lesson you will review the keys you have learnt. You have completed the alphabet keys and you can type all words. Now, you will learn to type words that begin with capital letters - proper nouns and the first word in a sentence.

The **Shift** keys are the large keys on both the right of your **semi-colon** key and and left of your a finger key. Holding down either the **Shift** key while pressing an alphabetic key will produce a capital letter.

Thus you can use the right **Shift** key or left **Shift** key at your convenience.



The caps lock key, located to the left of the A key, is also used to capitalized letters.

Warm-up Exercise

The Warm-up exercise is necessary to help you learn to stretch your fingers. Sit comfortably and place your hands on the 'hot' keys. Review by saying out loud the letters along the 'hot' keys: *asdf*; *lkj*. Do this without looking at your fingers. Review the 'cold' keys as well.





EXERCISE 34 (CAPS LOCK KEY)



The Caps Lock key is the large key located to the left of the A key. Strike the Caps Lock key with your A key finger, the pinky finger. They key is an on/off key for capital letters and lowercase letters. Some computer keyboards have a light on the key when it is goes on.

Use the Caps Lock key if you are typing a series of capital letters, example CXC, UNCEF, USA, UWI, etc. Don't forget to turn the Caps Lock key off when you are done and you wish to type lowercase letters. Also, if you press the Shift key while the Caps Lock is on you will get a lowercase letter.



If you make an error, continue typing. When you are finished, compare your typing with the passage.
